POCONO TOWNSHIP, MONROE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

ORDINANCE NO. 2018 –

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING AN ELECTRONIC DEVICE TAX IN THE TOWNSHIP OF POCONO, INCLUDING DEFINITIONS AND THE IMPOSITION OF THE TAX; PROCEDURES FOR COLLECTION OF THE TAX; PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION AND DISPOSITION OF MONIES COLLECTED.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, by the Board of Commissioners of Pocono Township, Monroe County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby **ENACTED AND ORDAINED** by virtue of the activity of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania known as the "First Class Township Code, as amended", as follows:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE

This Ordinance shall be known as the "Pocono Township Electronic Device Tax Ordinance."

SECTION 2. PURPOSE

This Ordinance is to provide for general revenue purposes by way of the levying, assessment and collection of taxes imposed upon certain electronic devices within Pocono Township.

SECTION 3. AUTHORITY FOR ENACTMENT

This Ordinance is enacted under authority of the Local Tax Enabling Act, P.L. 1257, No. 511, December 31, 1965, 53 P.S. 56901 et seq., as hereafter amended, supplemented, modified or reenacted by the General Assembly of Pennsylvania.

SECTION 4. DEFINITIONS

- A. <u>DEVICE</u> Any jukebox, mechanical amusement device, electronic video game or electronic amusement device for the use of which for profit a tax is levied under this article.
- B. <u>ELECTRONIC VIDEO GAME</u> Any device other than a jukebox or mechanical device which may be operated by the public generally for use as a game, entertainment, amusement or profit, whether or not registering a score and whether or not a prize is offered.
- C. <u>JUKEBOX</u> Any music vending machine, contrivance or device which, upon the insertion of a coin, slug, token, plate, disc or key into the slot, crevice or other opening, or

by the payment of any price, operates or may be operated for the emission of song, music or similar amusement.

- D. <u>MECHANICAL AMUSEMENT DEVICE</u> Any device other than a jukebox which, upon the insertion of a coin, slug, token, plate, disc or key may be operated by the public generally for use as a game, entertainment, amusement or profit, whether or not registering a score and whether or not a prize is offered.
- E. <u>PERSON</u> any natural person or persons, partnership, association, joint venture, or corporation. Whenever used in any clause prescribing and imposing a penalty, the term "person" as applied to a partnership or association shall mean the partners or members thereof, and as applied to a corporation, the officers or agents thereof. If applicable, the singular shall include the plural; the plural shall include the singular; and the masculine shall include the feminine

SECTION 5. IMPOSITION OF TAX

There is hereby imposed a tax for general revenue purposes under the authority of the Local Tax Enabling Act upon the privilege of using for profit within the Township of Pocono jukebox or mechanical amusement devices as herein defined. Such tax shall be collected and payable by the person owning the mechanical amusement device or jukebox as defined herein and each such device situate, located, utilized or placed within the Township shall bear clear identification thereon of the owner name and principal place of business. Such tax shall be payable at the following rate: On each mechanical amusement device or jukebox, \$50 per calendar year (January 1 through December 31) or any portion thereof.

SECTION 6. PAYMENT OF TAX; REPORT

The tax imposed under this article shall be payable on or before the 15th day of February of each calendar year to the Board of Commissioners of Pocono Township. For devices which are installed after the 15th day of February of each calendar year, the tax imposed under this article shall be paid prior to the use of the machine or device. No deduction or refund of any tax payable under this article shall be granted in the case of any device being destroyed, stolen, sold, confiscated or otherwise disposed of or transferred out of the Township of Pocono after the payment of such tax. Each payment is directed under this article shall be accompanied by a report by the owner/operator and/or person required to make such payment and report as set out herein. Said report to contain information as to the identification of the particular device upon which payment is being remitted.

SECTION 7. PENALTY FOR NONPAYMENT

In addition to any other remedies or penalties as set out herein, if any tax levied pursuant to this article shall not be paid when due, a penalty of 18% of the amount of the tax due and unpaid shall be added thereto.

SECTION 8. SUIT ON COLLECTION

The Board of Commissioners of Pocono Township shall have the power to institute proceedings against persons who violate or do not comply with the provisions of this article. If for any reason the tax is not paid when due and suit is brought for the recovery of any such tax, the person liable therefore shall, in addition, be liable for the cost of collection and interest and penalties herein imposed. All taxes, interest and penalties collected or recovered by the designated individual or Township Solicitor shall be paid into the Township Treasury as general revenue to be used for general revenue purposes.

SECTION 9. GAMBLING NOT PERMITTED

Nothing in this article shall in any way be construed to authorize, license or permit any gambling devices whatsoever or any mechanism which has been determined by the Courts of this Commonwealth to be a gambling device, or in any way contrary to the existing or future laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

SECTION 10. REPEALER

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed upon the effective date of this Ordinance.

SECTION 11. SEVERABILITY

If any sentence, clause, section or part of this Ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections or parts of this Ordinance.

SECTION 12. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall be effective five (5) days after the enactment hereof.

Also, present Leo DeVito, Township Solicitor, Jon Tressler – Township Engineer, B&J; Mike Gable-engineer, B&J; Patrick Briegel – Pocono Township Sewer Consultant; Donna Asure – Township Manager; Township Supervisors from Tobyhanna Township as well as Tobyhanna Township Manager and Assistant Manager, Township Engineer and Solicitor; David Horton and John Prevoznik of BCRA.

The work session was called to order at 6:08pm by President Lastowski with the Pledge of Allegiance.

There was no public comment.

The work session started off with a discussion of Tobyhanna's growth and the need for additional sewer and water capacity. The agreements were reviewed and discussed to clarify that as long as Pocono works within the two (2) million gallons per day already allotted to them they should be able to consider the request by Tobyhanna to provide additional sewer capacity.

The following topics were then discussed -

- ➤ Whether or not Pocono had additional capacity, over and above the MOU agreed upon amount of 440,000 gallons per day
- ➤ Have the Pocono sewer consultant and engineer taken into account the next phase of the sewer system and any outstanding projects that will need sewer in determining extra capacity
- > The current service area needs of Tobyhanna

BCRA brought to the attention of all that water needs may be an issue with the economic development proposed by Tobyhanna. The expansion will require a will serve letter by BCRA to Tobyhanna and BCRA is not certain that it has the capacity to provide for the needs.

BCRA explained their current financing of a loan to take the capacity from 1.4 to 2.0 million gallons per day but they believed that the additional capacity is to provide water to already existing commitments.

BCRA discussed the following concerns –

- > The pressure in the current line is to great to continue that way
- The water system is currently running at 1.3 mg/d at peak times and the capacity is only 1.4 mg/d

They must create redundancy in the system within the next 5 to 15 years which will be an additional \$10 - \$15 million dollars.

Those present then discussed how the issue of water and sewer needs are solved. It was thought that a meeting with DEP to explain the regionalization of working with Tobyhanna, Pocono and BCRA and the needs of the area should be arranged. Tobyhanna will contact DEP to ascertain their interest in having a meeting with all involved.

The current overages of Kalahari were discussed and the options to possibly correct such as pretreatment and/or equalization tanks.

The discussion of the rerate of the BCRA plant than occurred. There was discussion about a paper rerate, which is currently off the table, and a full rerate with the need and guarantee of a capital investment to accomplish.

Tobyhanna and BCRA representatives left the work session at 7:04pm with Tobyhanna to report back on a meeting with DEP. The Pocono Board took a short break.

The work session reconvened at 7:10pm.

Boucher & James and Patrick Briegel reported on the I&I concerns of BCRA. Pocono consultants believe that the I&I issue coming from the Pocono System is not as large a number as once believed and the new SCADA system is assisting in documenting those calculations.

Equalization, pre-treatment, jockey pumps at Pump Station #5 were all discussed as to the needs and the possible benefits.

The Board discussed the pros and cons of expanding the system into the "Phase II" area, the need of opening the Act 537 Plan, the forming of an authority to run the sewer system in Pocono and the amount of extra capacity they would feel comfortable offering to Tobyhanna Township at this time.

There was no public comment.

The work session adjourned at 8:10pm.

SECTION 1 – PURPOSE AND AUTHORIZATION

The name of the board shall be the "Board of Commissioners of Pocono Township" (the Board). The Board shall have all the rights, powers and duties respectively conferred upon Board of Commissioners pursuant to the Pennsylvania statutes, as amended, that govern townships of the first class.

SECTION 2 – OFFICE OF THE BOARD

The office of the Board shall be the Municipal Building where the Board records will be maintained. All correspondence shall be addressed to the Board c/o the Township Manager, 112 Township Drive, Tannersville, PA 18372. Copies of all agendas, minutes and resolutions of the Board shall be filed or recorded with the Secretary.

SECTION 3 – OFFICERS

- A. At the organizational meeting, the Board shall elect one commissioner as President and one commissioner as Vice-President. The Board shall promptly fill any officer vacancies.
- B. The President shall:
 - i. Preside over all Board meetings
 - ii. Vote on all motions
 - iii. Sign and execute documents as authorized by the Board
 - iv. Serve as the ceremonial representative of the Township for various functions which may be delegated as deemed appropriate

SECTION 4 – BOARD MEETINGS

- A. The Board shall hold regular meetings at 7:00pm on the first and third Monday of every month, except when the Municipal Building is closed due to public holiday or some other reason. In the event of such a scheduling conflict, an alternative meeting date may be scheduled by the Board. All meetings of the Board are open to the public, as required by the Pennsylvania General Statutes, unless otherwise specified.
- B. The Township Secretary will provide the board with draft meeting minutes within five (5) business days of the meeting. The draft minutes will be clearly marked as "DRAFT" and will not become official until the Board votes to approve them at a subsequent meeting. If the Board makes any changes in the draft minutes prior to the vote, the meeting minutes will be corrected to reflect the changes without strike through or redline before being marked final and placed in the meeting minute's book as the official minutes for that meeting.
- C. From time to time, at the Board's discretion, public workshops will be held to provide the Board the opportunity to discuss major events or projects in order to prepare for a vote at a regular or special meeting. Workshops are open to the public and will not include

- voting or ruling on any matters. The public may comment as provided for in Section 6.A below.
- D. The Board may hold special meetings which will be advertised and follow all procedures as outlined for Board Meetings.
- E. At the request of the Board, the Township Manager, Solicitor, Engineer, and Secretary shall participate in discussions at meetings.
- F. Commissioners may participate and vote via speakerphone, however technology may limit the total number per meeting. The Commissioners must be able to hear the meeting discussions and the audience must be able to hear the Commissioner(s) participating by phone.
- G. The Board shall fill appointments and vacancies in appointed boards and Commissions as they occur. Individuals interested in appointment or reappointment shall submit a letter of interest to the Township Manager, listing qualifications for appointment and any other pertinent information. The Board shall review all letters of interest and may conduct interviews and appoint individuals by a majority vote.
- H. The Board of Commissioners may remove an appointed member of a board for the following reasons
 - Failure to attend meetings Any member who fails to attend three (3) consecutive meetings or fifty percent (50%) of the board's meetings in a twelve (12) month period, without reasonable cause or excuse, may be removed by majority vote of the Board of Commissioners.
 - Termination of residency Any appointed member of a board who ceases to be a full-time resident of Pocono Township may be removed.

SECTION 5 – ORDER OF BUSINESS

- A. The agenda for all regular meetings of the Board shall include, but is not limited to, the regular items listed as follows:
 - 1. Open Meeting
 - 2. Pledge of Allegiance
 - 3. Roll Call
 - 4. Public Comment agenda and non-agenda matters
 - 5. Announcements
 - 6. Hearings
 - 7. Presentations
 - 8. Old Business such as approval of minutes
 - 9. New Business such as personnel, financial transactions, travel
 - 10. Report of the President
 - 11. Commissioners comments
 - 12. Reports
 - 13. Ordinances and Resolutions
 - 14. Public Comment

- 15. Executive Session (if necessary)
- 16. Adjournment
- B. All Commissioners and staff members shall submit their requested agenda items to the Township Manager no later than the Thursday preceding the scheduled meeting at noon. A draft agenda and supporting materials for regular meetings shall be prepared by the Township Manager and forwarded to the Board for review and comment no later than 4:30pm on Thursday. The draft agenda will reflect changes requested by the Board members. The draft agenda, clearly notating action items of the board, will be posted to the website with the assistance of township staff by the close of business on Friday prior to each meeting. Any change(s) to the agenda from the draft agenda posted on the township website to the final agenda presented at the meeting, will be clearly marked as added to agenda since the draft was posted. The board will not add agenda items during any meeting, unless it would work an undue hardship, or is a life or safety emergency.

SECTION 6 – PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

- A. The Public comment section of the order of business shall be that portion of the board meeting during which the public may address the board for no more than five (5) minutes per individual. The Board shall accept all public comment at beginning and end of meeting as noted on agenda. All questions or comments shall be directed to the Board President and shall not be directed to staff or invited guests. Further remarks or questions by the public may be allowed at the discretion of the President. The President reserves the right to end public participation at any meeting if it becomes clear that the Board will not be able to conduct its business in a timely manner.
- B. If the Board entertains a motion, not noted on the draft agenda posted to the website, the Public will have the opportunity to comment or ask a question after the motion has been made and seconded, but prior to the Board taking a vote.

<u>SECTION 7 – COMMITTEES</u>

- A. The Board shall appoint Commissioners to committees.
- B. There shall be a standing Finance committee consisting of two Commissioners who shall meet from time to time to review and make recommendations on all matters relating to the budget, financing, annual audit, and processing of payments.
- C. The Board may appoint other such committees as may be deemed necessary or desirable. Any committee so appointed shall have the duties or responsibilities assigned to it at the time of appointment.
- D. Committees may have non-voting members of the public as part of the committee.

E. No Commissioner shall be excluded from attending any Township meeting convened for the purpose of discussion of Township matters.

SECTION 8 – AMENDMENTS

These bylaws may be amended from time to time as deemed necessary or desirable by the Board by majority vote.

SECTION 9 – QUORUM

A quorum shall consist of three (3) members of the Board.

SECTION 10 – ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER

The most recent version of the Robert's Rules of Order shall be the authority in all matters of parliamentary procedure not otherwise stated in these bylaws. The Board shall elect a parliamentarian to enforce these rules.
